3.1. Project aim	To develop and implement comprehensive psychosocial and physical rehabilitation services in order to respond to the needs of people affected by Russia's war against Ukraine.
3.2. Project objectives	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To create a comprehensive methodology that includes psychosocial and physical rehabilitation services for war-affected people in order to help their mental recovery and return to a full life. 2. To strengthen the network of psychosocial and physical rehabilitation specialists in Ukraine through training and exchange of experience with Lithuanian and foreign specialists. 3. To train Ukrainian medical professionals and to engage them in coaching new trainers ("training of trainers" model).

Target group(s)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Ukrainian medical professionals (doctors, psychologists, ergotherapists, social workers, etc.) - Ukrainian citizens affected by the Russian-led war, especially vulnerable groups (internally displaced persons, persons with disabilities, families and relatives of the deceased, survivors of violence, veterans, etc.).
